

Call to Order:

District Director Edward Aylward called the meeting to order at 12:00 PM, CDT.

Reading of the District Mission:

The mission was read by Administration Manager Mel Fiecke-Ekensteen.

Adoption of the Agenda (District Director Edward Aylward):

District Director Edward Aylward presented the amendments to the meeting agenda. These are the amendments presented: following the review of the Meeting Agenda there will be approval of the May 6 Minutes and the Voting Procedure will be introduced by PDD DTM Dave Gibson. There were no objections to the agenda. The meeting agenda was adopted as amended.

Approval of Minutes (District Director Edward Aylward):

The minutes of the May 6, 2023, District Council Meeting were distributed via email. The District Council Meeting minutes were approved, without any objections/corrections.

Meeting Appointments (District Director Edward Aylward):

Dave Hoffman was appointed as timer. Diane Windingland, DTM was appointed as Credential Chair. Dave Gibson, DTM was appointed as Election Buddy Chair. Michael Orr, DTM was appointed as Parliamentarian. Johnny Harbieh was appointed as Chat Monitor/Co-Host.

Explanation of Voting Procedure (Dave Gibson):

If there is a need to cast a ballot, this will be done via Election Buddy. All voting members will be receiving ballots via email. There will be an allotted time to cast and collect ballots.

Credentials Report (Credentials Committee Chair Diane Windingland):

District 106 has **105** clubs in good standing, with 2 votes per club held by the President and Vice President Education for **210** votes possible. One third or **70** club votes, are required for a quorum. We have **95** clubs registered today. The district <u>does</u> have a quorum. Additionally, there is **19** District Executive Committee Members registered, giving a total number of ballots of **114**. For a simple majority, it is 50% + 1 or **58**.

The credentials report was adopted.

There were no objections, the appointed leaders/positions were approved.

District Budget (Finance Manager Janet Osmundson/District Director Edward Aylward): This budget was reviewed by Toastmasters International World Headquarters Finance Team. Upon approval of the District Council, the budget will be submitted to World Headquarters as approved. Our 2023-2024 budget has increased approximately \$5000 from the previous program year. This reflects growth in district member numbers. This is the proposed budget – Education and Training \$3,900, Marketing outside Toastmasters \$3,563, Club Growth \$2,500, Public Relations \$2,360, Recognition \$6,325, Travel \$6,149, Lodging \$6,977, Food and Meals \$5,174, Speech Contest \$1,781, Administration \$800. Membership dues projected is \$35,633. District Director Edward Aylward discussed the reason for the overspending. It is due to the cost of the annual training for district directors, program quality directors and club growth directors. It was very expensive due to the venue set by Toastmasters International. Our district has a surplus of \$32,000 and because of that our budget may be approved with an overspend. The district will monitor spending throughout the year and cutback if the opportunity presents itself to do so. We will continue to add members so our revenue continues to increase and do what we can to offset that. Lastly, there was a question asked is there money for food if we have a hybrid contest - the answer is yes. There were no objections, the 2023-2024 budget was adopted.

Audit Committee Report (Janet Osmundson on behalf of Jared Akerman):

The audit for the first half of the year was completed successfully. The audit team did not identify any discrepancies in the financials. The audit for the second half of the year is 90% complete. Once again, the audit team has not identified any discrepancies in the financials. The 2023-2024 audit committee report was adopted.

Division Director Reports:

Division A Director Dana Lamminmaki:

Division A highlights include:

- 38% of the club visits are completed.
- Riverview Club has five goals met and Westfort Club has three goals met to be becoming distinguished clubs.
- Paul Bunyan Club from Area 2 had a joint meeting with Focus Club, our prison club in Area 4.
- Discussions that are ongoing about an Area 1 open house with our regional 4 advisor.
- Area Contests and Division Contest are scheduled in October/November.
- Speechcraft beginning in late September in Thunder Bay.

Division B Director Brian Rice: (Edward Aylward on behalf of Brian Rice)

Division B has each of the Area Directors filled, and they are actively planning their speech competitions.

In Division C, there are four clubs over 20 members - White Bear Toastmasters, Shock, Rhythm and Talk, Minnesota Returned Peace Corp Volunteers and Wordsmiths. Many clubs have met the membership requirement in the new dues period. The \$45 renewal cost prior to August 15 was an incentive for clubs to get their dues in early. Officer Training: Northside Toastmasters, Wordsmiths, Free Thought, Shock, Rhythm and Talk and Promote the Possibilities achieved the Magnificent 7 Award. Many other clubs achieved four or more officers trained. Area Contests and Division Contest are scheduled: Area 23 and 25 contest will be on October 18, Area 22 and 24 contest will be on October 17 and will be planning a date for the Area 21 contest. Division C contest will be on November 1. The area contests are on Zoom and a possibility of a hybrid contest for the Division contest.

Division D has opening for area directors. There will be a club that will cease and to recover the charter to create a corporate club of architects that wish to start a club. All the area contests will be hybrid and scheduled for the same day.

Trio Reports:

Club Growth Director's Report - Matt Villella

The first 3 months of the Toastmaster year has been challenging but so rewarding. We have been notified by a few clubs that their charter will be handed in. We want to ensure that those who want to continue the Toastmaster journey will. Currently, we have three clubs that are in demo phase. As a team, we are doing cold calls to everyone and everywhere in the region that might benefit from Toastmasters. The team has been working hard and helping to strengthen the clubs that we have. We are happy to announce the Club Mentorship Program. We are reaching out to Distinguished Clubs from last year to help low member clubs. This program has seen four or five members of a club come

for three meetings and help with roles and give opportunities to have strong open houses and quality meetings. We are hoping to have 15 clubs mentored, which will have 30 clubs participating in total. There are opportunities for clubs to participate – there are prizes, such as a pizza party paid by the Club Growth Director. We already have clubs been identified to be participating in this program and has been identified in their area director reports.

We spent a few days in Thunder Bay creating a robust District Success Plan, this has been modified a few times and has been finally submitted to Toastmasters International. The marketing package and the communication plan have also been submitted. These are requirements for Toastmasters International and we are ahead of the deadline.

I have been attending as many club meetings as I possibly can as well as attending open houses. We have some incentives that will be implemented through the year, check out social media because that is where it will be posted. We are currently in the Smedley New Membership Program from Toastmasters International which ends on September 30, add five new members or reinstated members will get you a little something from Toastmasters International. There are D106 open house incentives. The District Director has set a goal of four open houses per club. If you have an open house and add at least two new members, reach out to me and you might be eligible for some great prizes, including a Zoom membership, Canva, Photo Editor or \$100 gift card from the TI store. Please reach to us so we know how we can help and keep track to give credit.

We are excited to announce that our Region 4 Advisor, David Woodcock will be doing a North Shore tour for open houses, promoting Toastmasters, and supporting our brand in the areas that does not really get attention. This will be happening October 24 – 28.

If you are having trouble having a quality meeting, reach out, we can figure out a plan. I am here for you as well as Ed and Katy are here for you, we want to help you and we want to attend meetings if we can. I encourage you to have strong meetings, perhaps look at Speechcraft and/or participate in the Club Mentorship Program. We have the resources to help you, let us help.

Program Quality Director's Report - Katy Hursh

Ninety percent of our area and division directors have completed seven hours of district officer training in the three sessions of training. The first session we discussed our Toastmaster birthdays, the second training Michael Carlton shared the importance of leveraging your team, and the last session Ben Smith presented successful speech contests. We are already at 30% of our district area visits being completed. Congratulations to our area directors. We still have until November to finish. Good job team!

The club officer training was led by our new district officer trainer, Beth Plamondon and she had scheduled 11 training sessions from June to August 31. We had club officers from all over the world attend. Our last session we had over 70 people in attendance. It was rewarding to observe our district training team as they facilitated our sessions and just watch them develop in the process was very exciting. We finished with 66.7% of our club officers trained, which was an increase from last year of 58%. The district trio also completed 16 hours of training at our conference in the Bahamas and the last portion of that week we went to the international conference. I highly recommend if you have not attended a Toastmasters Convention to do so. Our next one is in Anaheim, California on August 14 – 17.

Our club speech contests are underway with our clubs having contests now, our area contests in October and our division contests in November. The district leadership team is striving to assist all its' members to have a successful experience as they develop into their highest potential.

It is the highest distinguished honor available in Toastmasters International for any district in the world.

Early in 2024, submission of educational awards will be automatically in Pathways and Club Central at the same time, it will be a one step process. There will be modifications coming to Pathways as well. There will be new, different content in Pathways shortly.

This is an amazing district; I am having such fun visiting and so much fun at our weekly meetings with Matt and Katy. It will be a great honor to have our Region Advisor here. As Katy pointed out, we will be having our Spring Conference in May in one of suburbs of the Twin Cities again. We need member numbers to be higher here as the cost in the Twin Cites is much higher than Duluth. We received a communication from Toastmasters International that which says, "You are eligible to have a Toastmasters International Board Officer attend your annual conference." I understand that term means that we are eligible to have with us either 2nd Vice President, 1st Vice President, President Elect, President, Immediate Past President, or Chief Officer of Toastmasters International. It will be a great privilege to have them at our conference.
